Noteflight is an online music writing application that lets you create, view, print, and hear music notation with professional quality, right in your web browser.



How do my students complete the worksheets?

The Online Workbook contains digital versions of the worksheets found in the printed workbook for your textbook. Each worksheet contains directions on how it should be completed. After completing a worksheet in the Noteflight editor, students should click the Turn In This Score button found at the top of the worksheet to submit it for grading. After turning in the worksheet, students should click on the Done button in the lower right corner to close the worksheet and return to the workshook.

Note: If the Turn In This Score button is closed or does not appear at the top of the worksheet, students should click on the Save cloud icon, close the worksheet, and reopen it. The Turn In This Score button should then be displayed.
